The least fulfilled needs of former foster youth are housing and employment. ILP is now offering the START program in an effort to address this issue. Butte County Transitional Housing Placement Programs or THPP's are some of the most active and varied in the state. Remi Vista, Youth and Family and Youth For Change each offer unique programs. ILP encourages youth, care providers, and social workers to become familiar with each. Frequently Asked Questions sheets for each program are available. Our county's THPP providers, Butte County CSD staff and ILP staff meet on a regular basis. Interested parties can contact ILP if they are interested in sitting in on one of the meetings.

All teens 16 and up who are in placement are entitled to ILP services*. If you know of an unrefereed teen aged sixteen or up who lives in a foster home or a group home please contact ILP. ILP serves teens placed from other counties as well as Butte County teens. Former foster youth aged 16 to 21, who were in placement at 16 or older, can call Butte County ILP for support in the areas of employment, housing, connecting with community resources and more. ILP served 45 after care youth in the 2nd quarter of this year. We have a toll free number, 1-888-893-4011, for calls from outside of the Chico area. *Contact ILP to determine eligibility.

Fosteryouth.net is a resource website for current and former foster youth. Butte and fourteen other northern counties are involved in this project. While parts of this site are "under construction", it contains a great deal of useful information.
